This is one of many initiatives Stacy wants to implement in the future!







PROVIDING TRAUMA-INFORMED The fall, Chariots started a partnership with Global Trauma CARE

In the fall, Chariots started a partnership with Global Trauma Recovery Institute to begin training on staff to provide trauma-informed care. Dr. Heather Evans and Carol King, LPC taught the class. Each home's social worker and the National Program Manager participated in this 12-week online weekly class that consisted of recorded powerpoint presentations and an interactive discussion. The goal was to educate our staff to identify trauma and know how to respond.

This year Veronica, a freshman in high school, was diagnosed with Lymphedema. In December, Vera received support supplies from a donor in the United States who understands the impact of Lymphedema through personal experience. The Chariots for Hope US based team had the opportunity to train the nurses at Vera's school as well as the staff at Ogada Children's Home to wrap her legs to decrease swelling.



FAMILY TRIPS

One way that Chariots was impacted by the global pandemic was our inability to visit our homes in Kenya for 16 months. We praise God for lessening restrictions which allowed for US staff members to travel in 2021!

Crystal and Mark had the opportunity to visit Kenya for the first time since February 2020. On this trip, our team celebrated the opening of new staff housing units at Ogada Children's Home. As a part of a new initiative to prepare high school students for further education, our team assisted our program manager in leading students through an online strengths assessment. The trip ended with an encouraging meeting where home leadership gathered together to share ideas, dream for the future, and enjoy time together.





November

The last trip of the year was the first time the entire US Chariots team traveled together. During this trip, Chariots met with representatives from the University of Elderet to talk about developing a partnership to establish a sustainable farm at Kaptagat Children's Home. The team was also able to join with Integrity Foundation, a US partner of Mogogosiek Baby Home, to celebrate the retirement of Priscillah, the home manager. The team finished the trip by hand delivering packages to the excited children living at Maai Mahiu Children's Home!












God Provides
